Respect For Law

Captain Vic Wahl gave an update on the Madison Police Department. MPD covers an areas of over 28 sq mile, 116 public parks and 17 public school districts. Having significantly outgrown their current facilities, intended to house 56 officers but currently housing 93), Captain Wahl reemphasized the importance of a new precinct station on the near west side that is currently in the planning stages. He also provided insight regarding the benefits and challenges of all officers equipped with body cameras.

Josh Acker has been with the force for several years and was selected to receive the honor for his dedicated service to the department and his work on the 'Special Events Team.'

Stephanie Drescher was honored not only for her outstanding work as an officer, but more notably for patience and abilities as a Field Training officer.


